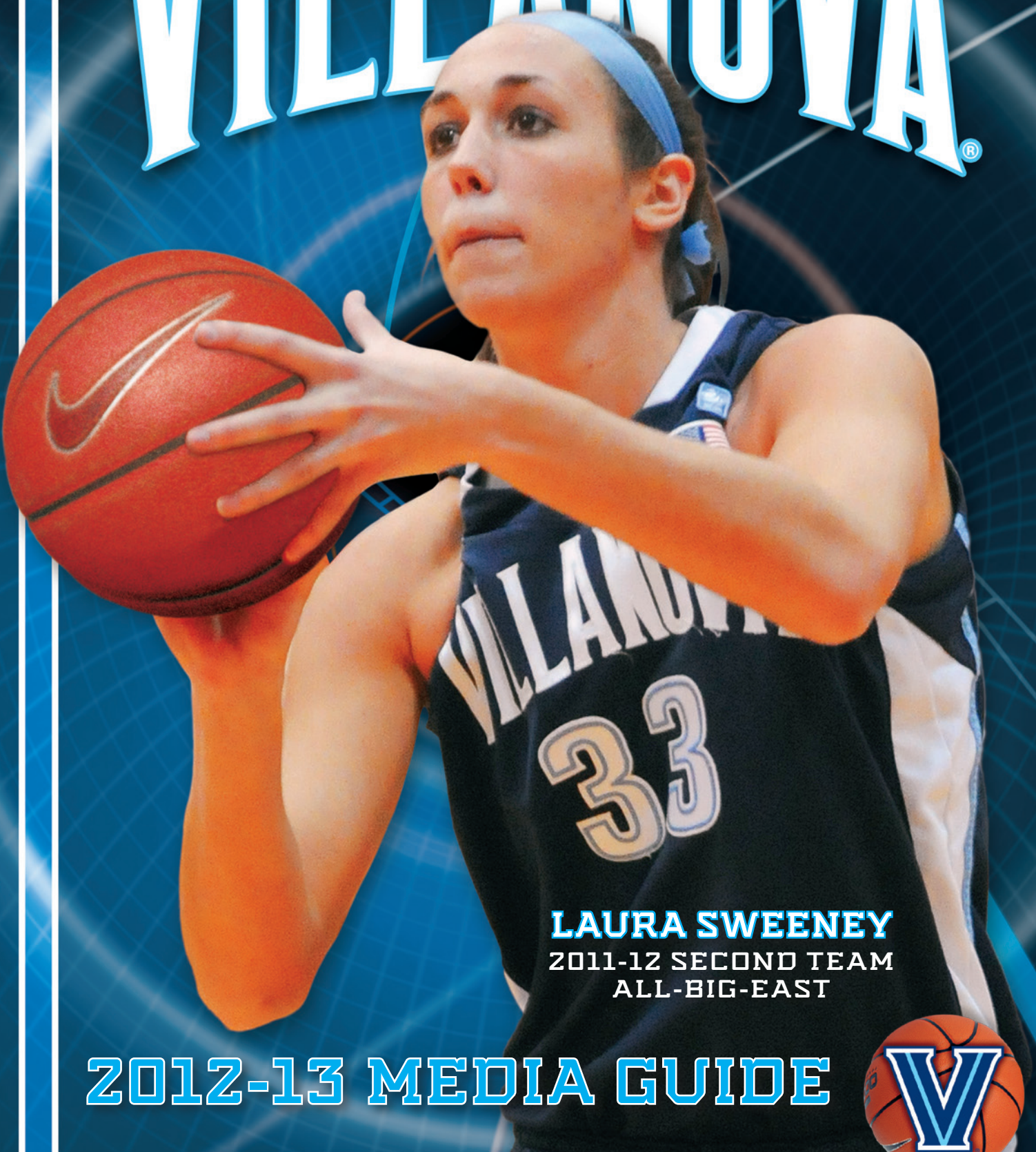

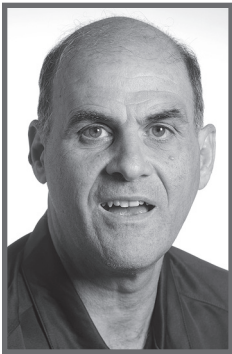

# HEAD COACH HARRY PERRETTA



Now in his 35th year as head coach of the Villanova women's basketball program, Harry Perretta has established himself as one of the most respected and knowledgeable coaches in the country. A true

teacher both on and off the court, Perretta strives to have a positive influence on his student-athletes not only as basketball players, but also as people.

The 2011-12 season was a milestone year for Perretta. On Nov. 12, 2011, he earned his 600th career victory with a 76-47 victory at Iona. By reaching this milestone, Perretta becomes the 35th coach in the history of women's basketball at any level to reach the 600-win plateau, including the 22nd Division I coach to accomplish the feat. He is also just the seventh Division I coach to win 600 games at one school.

His second milestone of the 2011-12 season came at DePaul on Feb. 8 when Perretta coached in his 1,000th career game,

becoming just the seventh coach in the history of NCAA women's basketball at any level to coach 1,000 games at the same school.

Perretta led his team last year to a 19-15 overall record and bid to the WNIT. This was the team's 10th postseason appearance in the last 13 seasons. In the WNIT, the Wildcats defeated American and Illinois State before falling at Colorado in the third round. Villanova tallied a 4-0 mark in the Philadelphia Big Five last season to capture the program's 13th City Series title. For his efforts, Perretta earned Big Five Coach of the Year accolades. Also, last year, he guided junior forward Laura Sweeney to second team All-Big East honors and redshirt freshman Lauren Burford to a spot on the Big East All-Rookie team.

Entering the 2012-13 season, Perretta ranks 23rd on the winningest active collegiate coaching list with a 617-393 career record. The 617 victories rank him as the all-time winningest coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women.

During the 2008-09 season, Perretta led the Wildcats to the NCAA Tournament for the ninth time in his Villanova career. This marked the ninth postseason appearance in

the previous 10 years for the Wildcats. After playing in the 2000 WNIT, Villanova went to four consecutive NCAA Tournaments from 2001-2004 before playing in the WNIT in 2005, 2006 and 2008. Picked to finish 10th in the pre-season Big East Conference coaches poll, the Wildcats tallied a 10-6 league mark and finished tied for fourth in the conference standings. For his efforts in 2008-09, Perretta was named the Big East Conference Co-Coach of the Year. This is the third time in his career that he has garnered Big East Coach of the Year distinction.

Under Perretta's tutelage in 2008-09, senior forward Laura Kurz was a unanimous first team All-Big East selection, in addition to being named the Big East Co-Most Improved Player. Kurz finished her senior campaign averaging 17.4 points per game and 7.2 rebounds per contest. She was also named the Philadelphia Big Five Player of the Year.

Perretta registered his 14th career 20-win season in 2005-06 by leading the Wildcats to a 21-11 record. This was the fifth time in six years that Perretta led his team to a 20-win campaign. Also, in 2005-06, Perretta coached senior forward Liad Suez-Karni to first team All-Big East accolades.

# HEAD COACH HARRY PERRETTA

In 2004-05, Perretta became the 26th Division I women's basketball head coach to win 500 games when the Wildcats defeated Pittsburgh, 70-49, on February 2. Villanova finished the season with a 19-12 overall record and qualified for the postseason with a WNIT berth.

One year earlier in 2003-04, Perretta led his team to a fourth-straight 20-win campaign and a fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament berth where the Wildcats advanced to the second round. Perretta also coached his squad to a second-straight Philadelphia Big Five title in 2003-04. For his efforts, he was named Big Five Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season.

The 2002-03 season was a special one for Perretta and the Wildcats. In addition to an impressive 28-6 overall record and a 12-4 Big East Conference mark, Perretta led the Wildcats to their third Big East Conference Tournament championship and first since 1987 with an improbable 52-48 upset over previously unbeaten Connecticut. The win snapped Connecticut's then NCAA Division I women's basketball record of 70-straight victories and ended Connecticut's streak of nine-straight conference tournament championships.

The 28 wins recorded in 2002-03 is the second most victories in school history. Villanova was rewarded for its season by earning a No. 2 seed in the 2002-03 NCAA Tournament which is the highest seed ever for a Philadelphia area women's basketball team. In the NCAA Tournament, the Wildcats recorded wins over St. Francis (Pa.), George Washington and Colorado and advanced to the Elite Eight for the first time in the program's history. Also, during the 2002-03 season, Villanova went 4-0 in the Philadelphia Big Five to capture the City Series championship and he was named the Big Five Coach of the Year. Under Perretta's guidance, senior guard Trish Juhline led the Big East in scoring and garnered first team All-Big East acclaim for the second-straight year, while senior forward Katie Davis was named second team All-Big East and junior guard/forward Courtney Mix was a Big East Honorable Mention Team selection. In addition, Juhline was named the Big East Tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

In 2001-02, Perretta guided Villanova to a 20-11 mark and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. In the NCAA's, Villanova received the No. 9 seed in the west region where they defeated Pepperdine in the first round before losing to No. 1 seed Oklahoma in the second round. Perretta helped Juhline become the first Wildcat since 1994-95 to be named first team All-Big East. Perretta was also instrumental in helping senior point guard Mimi Riley earn Big East Honorable

Mention acclaim in 2001-02

The 2000-01 season was a memorable one for Perretta, as he led his team to a 22-9 overall record and a berth in the NCAA Tournament where they advanced to the second round. In a 60-55 win over Temple on Dec. 2, 2000, Perretta won his 400th career game and with the 61-45 victory over Providence on Feb. 24, 2001, he became the all-time winningest coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women with career win number 414. For his efforts in 2000-01, Perretta was named the Philadelphia Big Five Co-Coach of the Year. Also that season, Perretta coached senior center Brandi Barnes to third team All-Big East distinction and Juhline garnered Big East Honorable Mention acclaim. In the Philadelphia Big Five, Mix was named Rookie of the Year.

In 1995-96, Perretta led his team to a 21-7 record and added to his already impressive resume when he earned Big East Coach of the Year honors along with the Philadelphia Big Five Coach-of-the-Year award. Already the winningest coach in Villanova women's basketball history, on January 8, 1995 against the Georgetown Hoyas, Perretta earned his 300th career win at the age of 39.

The dean of the Big East and Big 5 coaches, Perretta has brought the Wildcats national respect and success during his tenure at Villanova. Always a crowd favorite wherever he goes, he is one of the most animated and vocal coaches in the country, continually instructing his players during the course of a game. Year-in and year-out, his teams are feared for their aggressive play, disciplined style, defensive prowess and pre-game preparations of an opponent.

A teacher of basketball, Perretta also realizes the importance of the overall college experience. He and his staff follow closely each player's academic progress, and in his 35 years at Villanova, 99 percent of the student-athletes who has stayed all four years has received her degree. Perretta is also a firm believer of using the basketball experience to teach his players lessons on life. Upon graduation, it is a sure bet that Perretta's players will leave Villanova as better basketball players, in addition to being prepared to be a success in whatever career avenue they choose.

During his career on the Main Line, he has led the Wildcats to nine NCAA Tournament appearances, six WNIT berths, nation-

al rankings in the *Associated Press* poll, Big East regular season and tournament championships in both 1985-86 and 1986-87, the 2003 Big East Tournament title, nine outright and four shared Big 5 titles, and fourteen 20-win or better seasons. In addition, one of his players, Shelly Pennefather, was recognized in 1987 as the nation's top women's basketball player, winning the Margaret Wade Trophy and earning Kodak All-America honors.

Perretta began his career on the Main Line in 1978 at the age of 22, the youngest coach ever to head a women's program at Villanova. In his first season, he led the 'Cats to a 17-8 record and was a finalist for the AIAW small college coach of the year. During his career, Perretta and the Wildcats have had many highlights, including reaching the Final Four of the AIAW in 1982. The 1982-83 season saw Villanova begin play in NCAA Division I and in the Big East Conference. Since joining the Big East in 1982, Perretta has compiled a 271-232 conference record.

Perretta attended Lycoming College after earning All-Catholic League honors at Monsignor Bonner High School in Upper Darby, Pa. His playing career was cut short, however, by an ankle injury during his freshman year at Lycoming. Perretta spent the remainder of his college years assisting Lycoming's varsity and junior varsity programs as a coach, and he also aided the women's program. He received his bachelor's degree in social studies and a secondary teaching certificate in 1978. In 1995, he earned his Master's Degree in Education from Villanova.

Perretta is married to the former Helen Koskinen and they are the parents of a 14-year old son, Stephen William and an 12-year old son Michael John. Together, they reside in Drexel Hill, Pa.

Joe Mullaney returns to the Wildcats for his 17th season in 2012-13. As the team's Associate Head Coach, he is involved with all aspects of on-court coaching and pre-game scouting of opponents. He came to the Main Line in 1996 and was elevated to his current

position in 1998-99.

Prior to beginning his tenure with the Wildcats, Mullaney was the head women's basketball coach at St. John's University for 12 seasons. He compiled a 168-173 mark during his tenure and led his team to the 1988 Big East Tournament championship and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. Mullaney was also the head coach at Providence College from 1980-83 and registered a 66-27 mark with the Friars.

Throughout his career as a head coach, Mullaney recorded three seasons with at least 20 victories. He was named the 1990-91 Big East Conference Coach of the Year.

Mullaney's coaching career got its start in 1978-79 when he served as the head boys basketball coach at Warwick Veterans Memorial High School in his hometown of Warwick, R.I. Following his one year stint at the high school level, Mullaney became the assistant men's coach at Rhode Island College from 1979-80, before taking over the reigns of the Providence women's program.

He is a 1978 graduate of Providence College where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration. During his playing days, Mullaney participated in two NCAA Tournaments and the NIT semifinals once.

Mullaney and his wife Kathy reside in Downingtown, Pa. and are the parents of four children: Meghan (32), Amie Beth (30), Patrick Joseph (25) and Sean Connor (21). Meghan graduated from Villanova in 2002, while Amie earned her Villanova degree in 2005. Patrick earned his degree from Villanova in 2009, while Sean is currently a junior on the Main Line.

# BIG EAST CONFERENCE

The 2012-13 academic year is the 34th in the BIG EAST / BIG FIVE of The BIG EAST Conference as the unique consortium marches on competing at the highest level with integrity and sportsmanship.

The BIG EAST has gone through membership changes since its birth and continues to make strides in improving the quality and depth of the storied league.

The BIG EAST Conference has been always been driven by lofty goals. The outstanding performances of the student-athletes at BIG EAST schools are evidence of the league's proud tradition of success. The league has always been able to boast that many of its best students are also its best athletes. The 2011-12 year was no different.

In the athletic arena, BIG EAST student-athletes again enjoyed success on the national stage. The Georgetown women's cross country team captured its first NCAA Championship. The win by the Hoyas marked the third-straight year a BIG EAST team has won the women's cross country championship, with Villanova winning the past two. The Louisville men's basketball team advanced to the Final Four in New Orleans. Connecticut field hockey reached the NCAA semifinals, as did the Notre Dame men's lacrosse team. The Irish women's basketball team and Syracuse women's lacrosse team each reached the NCAA finals. USF softball reached the Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City, Okla., for the first time in program BIG EAST / BIG FIVE.

The BIG EAST placed two teams in the NCAA Women's Final Four for the third time in the last four years as Connecticut joined Notre Dame in Denver, with the Fighting Irish advancing to the national title game for the second-straight year.

BIG EAST student-athletes won five NCAA championships. Sheila Reid won her second-straight NCAA Women's Cross Country title. Syracuse hurdler Jarret Eaton won the 60-meter hurdle championship in the NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championship. Notre Dame won the distance medley relay at the same championship. Georgetown's Emily Infeld won the 3,000-meter run. Carlos Almeida of Louisville won the 200-yard breaststroke at the NCAA Swimming & Diving Championships.

BIG EAST football maintained its national profile as a competitively balanced group.



Three BIG EAST teams won bowl games, while the BIG EAST representative in the Bowl Championship Series won its bowl game for the fourth time in the last seven years- a streak that includes wins against the ACC, Big 12 and SEC champions.

The BIG EAST became the nation's largest Division I-A conference in 2005-06 when five new members began competing – the University of Cincinnati, DePaul University, the University of Louisville, Marquette University and the University of South Florida.

BIG EAST institutions reside in 18 of the nation's top 50 largest media markets, including New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., Tampa, Pittsburgh, Hartford, Cincinnati and Milwaukee. With its newest members, BIG EAST markets contain more than one-fourth of all television households in the U.S. The BIG EAST will welcome UCF, Houston, Memphis, SMU and Temple in all sports in 2013-14. Temple football will join the league in 2012, with Boise State and San Diego State joining the following year and Navy in 2015.

Since opening its doors in 1979, the league has won 32 national championships in six different sports and 137 student-athletes have won individual national titles through 2011-12.

BIG EAST basketball squads have captured 11 titles in the last 13 years. In 2003-04, Connecticut became the first school in NCAA BIG EAST / BIG FIVE to win the men's and

women's NCAA basketball titles in the same season. In '02-03, the BIG EAST became the first conference in NCAA BIG EAST / BIG FIVE to win the men's and women's titles in the same year when the Syracuse men and the Connecticut women captured their respective national championships. The BIG EAST placed three men's basketball teams in the Final Four in 1985, the only time this has occurred in NCAA BIG EAST / BIG FIVE.

Proactive movement has been a signature strategy for the conference that was born in 1979. The BIG EAST continually turns challenges into opportunities to become stronger. The conference currently crowns champions in 24 sports.

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979, following a meeting of athletic directors from Providence College, St. John's, Georgetown and Syracuse universities. Seton Hall, Connecticut and Boston College completed the original seven school alliance.

While the membership has both increased and changed, the focus of the BIG EAST has not wavered. The conference reflects a tradition of broad based programs, led by administrators and coaches who place a constant emphasis on academic integrity. Its student athletes own significantly high graduation rates and their record of scholastic achievement notably show a balance between intercollegiate athletics and academics.



## BIG EAST CONFERENCE

Any successful organization has had the good fortune to have outstanding leadership. The BIG EAST primarily was the brainchild of Dave Gavitt, who was the conference's first Commissioner. Michael Tranghese, the league's first full-time employee, and for 11 years the associate to Gavitt, became Commissioner in 1990. In his first year, he administered the formation of The BIG EAST Football Conference. John Marinatto was the third commissioner of the BIG EAST, serving from 2009-

2012, after seven years as the conference's senior associate commissioner. Mike Aresco became the conference's fourth commissioner in 2012.

The league has long been considered a leader in innovative concepts in promotion and publicity, particularly regarding television. Those efforts have resulted in unparalleled visibility for BIG EAST student athletes. The conference has enjoyed longstanding relationships with CBS, ESPN, Inc. and ABC.

BIG EAST men's basketball games are regular sellouts at campus and major public arenas, including the annual men's BIG EAST Championship in Madison Square Garden. The women's basketball championship has led all conferences in attendance for the past nine years. Attendance figures also are significant in soccer and baseball.

The BIG EAST has its headquarters in Providence where the conference administers to more than 5,500 student-athletes.

## MICHAEL L. ARESKO • BIG EAST COMMISSIONER

Mike Aresco, one of the most influential leaders in collegiate sports television, was named Commissioner of The BIG EAST Conference on August 14, 2012.

Aresco came to the BIG EAST from CBS Sports where he was Executive Vice President, Programming. He was responsible for all college sports programming for CBS Sports and CBS Sports Network. Aresco oversaw the acquisition and management of CBS Sports college properties, including the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship, regular-season college basketball

and football, conference basketball championship games, football bowl games and other programming. His responsibilities included game selection and scheduling, day-to-day operations, contract negotiations, identification of future acquisitions, development of programming strategies and coordination of new media and marketing initiatives.

Aresco played an integral role in the landmark deal that created the CBS Sports-Turner Broadcasting partnership, which resulted in the acquisition of the NCAA Men's Division I Basketball Championship rights through 2024. He managed the complex 14-year agreement that provides expanded national broadcast and cable coverage of the NCAA basketball championship. Aresco also was instrumental in the CBS Television Network's groundbreaking bundled rights agreement with the NCAA which granted CBS exclusive rights to the NCAA Tournament from 2003 through 2010. The 2010 NCAA Championship won a Sports Emmy in the Outstanding Playoff Coverage category. Aresco also played a key role in negotiating the marketing agreement that coincided with the original NCAA deal and was instrumental in creating a partnership with IMG and the NCAA to assist in acquiring new NCAA corporate sponsors. He also was a significant contributor in the development of new media platforms for the NCAA Championship, including March Madness on Demand, CBS' highly successful streaming platform.

In 2008, Aresco negotiated a historic 15-year agreement with the

Southeastern Conference to televise the league's football and basketball games. The agreement also provided multiple new media rights for CBS, CBS Sports Network and CBS Interactive. He forged numerous basketball agreements with major conferences, including the BIG EAST, ACC, Big Ten, Pac-12 and Big 12. Aresco recently negotiated 10-year extensions of the Army-Navy and Notre Dame-Navy football rivalries.

Aresco was the creator and executive producer of The Tony Barnhart Show, the critically-acclaimed college football show, as well as Court-side with Seth Davis, a highly-regarded weekly show devoted to college basketball, both of which air on the CBS Sports Network.

In 2004, he was appointed by the late NCAA President Myles Brand to the Basketball Partnership, a select panel whose mission was to explore ways to improve and promote college basketball. He is a charter member of the steering committee of the Columbia University/New York City Chapter of the National Football Foundation and serves on the board of the National Sports Marketing Network.

Aresco joined CBS Sports from ESPN where he was responsible for overseeing the acquisition, scheduling and development of long-term strategies for all ESPN college sports properties. Earlier in his tenure at ESPN, he was responsible for programming a wide variety of sports properties, including College Football Association, Big 10, and Pac-10 college football, NCAA events, including early rounds of the NCAA basketball tournament, the College World Series and various professional sports events, including thoroughbred racing, Top Rank Boxing, CFL football, Australian Rules Football, rodeo and yachting. He was the architect of ESPN's signature Thursday night college football series and helped develop ESPN's Bowl Week. He joined ESPN in 1984 as Counsel and was named Assistant General Counsel in 1988 before moving to the programming department.

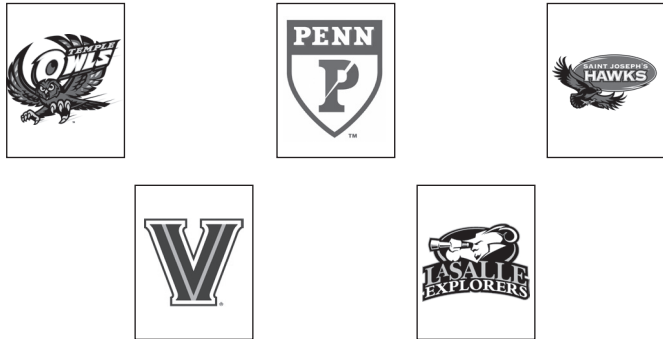
Aresco is a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Tufts University (B.A., magna cum laude, BIG EAST / BIG FIVE), the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy at Tufts (M.A., international relations), where he held a John Moors Cabot Scholarship, and the University of Connecticut Law School (J.D.). He practiced law privately in Hartford, Conn., for several years.

Aresco, 62, and his wife, Sharon, have two adult sons, Matthew, an Emmy-nominated television producer who owns a production company in Connecticut, and Brett, an aspiring actor who lives in New York City.

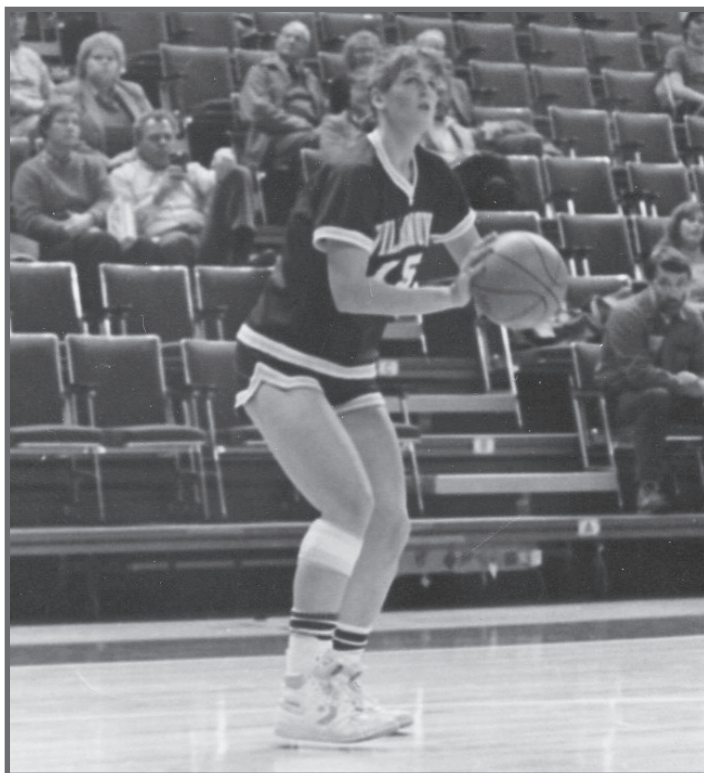

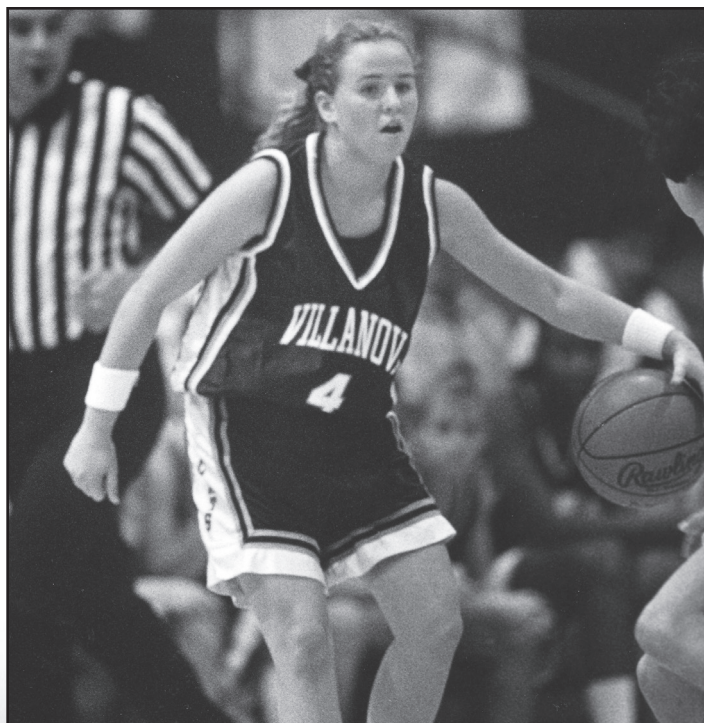

## A GLIMPSE OF VILLANOVA

**F**ounded in 1842 by the friars of the Order of St. Augustine, Villanova is a comprehensive Roman Catholic institution that welcomes students of all faiths. The University offers a wide variety of degree programs through four colleges: the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, the Villanova School of Business, the College of Engineering, and the College of Nursing, as well as the Villanova School of Law.

### **AN EXCELLENT ACADEMIC REPUTATION**

For nearly two decades, Villanova has ranked first in *U.S. News & World Report's* "America's Best Colleges" in its category of Master's Universities (North). Villanova is also a member of the two most prestigious honor societies – Phi Beta Kappa and Phi Kappa Phi. Villanova's College of Nursing is designated a Center of Excellence in Nursing Education by the National League for Nursing.

The value of the Villanova education has also been recognized: *U.S. News & World*

*Report* ranks Villanova first in Great Schools, Great Prices (Master's, North Region) and Bloomberg BusinessWeek ranks Villanova in the top 25 nationwide in Top Undergraduate Return on Investment.

### **THE STUDENTS**

Villanova's more than 6,300 undergraduates come from 45 states plus Washington, D.C.; Guam; Puerto Rico; the U.S. Virgin Islands; and 53 foreign countries. The mid 50 percent SAT scores of the recently admitted class is 1330–1440/1600, ACT: 30–33, and the GPA range is 3.80–4.20 on a weighted 4.0 scale. 53 percent of first-year students receive need-based financial assistance from the University.

### **THE FACULTY**

Villanova's 585 full-time faculty - 90 percent of whom hold the highest degree in their field - teach classes that average 22 students. The student : faculty ratio is 11:1.

### **THE CAMPUS**

Located in a suburban community 12 miles west of Philadelphia, the picturesque 254-acre campus features more than 60 buildings, including a library with more than 800,000 volumes, an 11,800 seat stadium, state of the art academic facilities, and 26 residence halls.

### **THE EXPERIENCE**

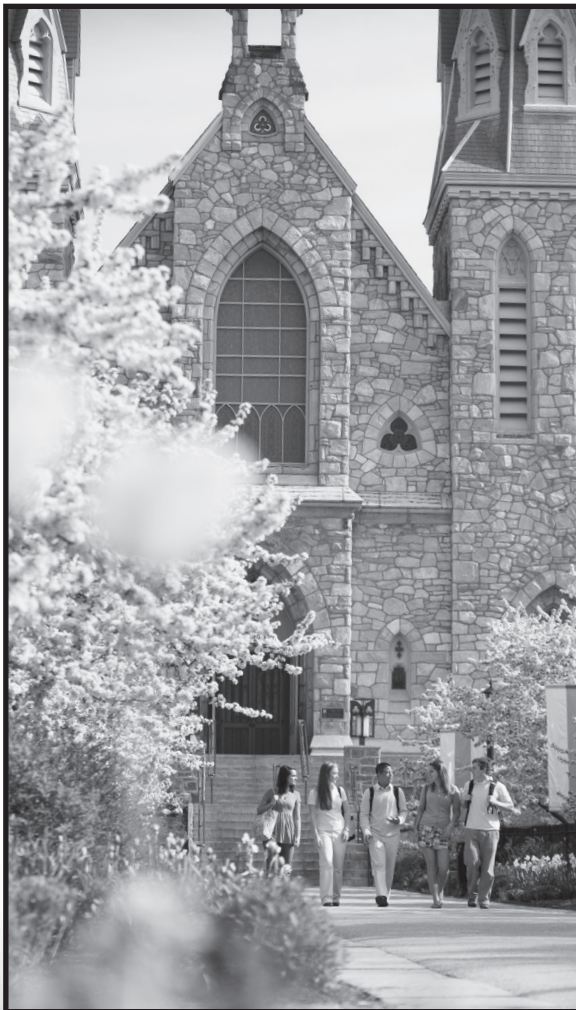
Villanova is a welcoming, caring community of learners. Villanova offers themed Learning Communities, which create innovative educational environments where first-year student live in the same residence hall, take their Augustine and Culture Seminar together, and participate in tailored co-curricular programs. Service to others through volunteerism and



service-learning projects is a fundamental part of the Villanova experience, and 75 percent of undergraduates participate. Villanova students may also choose to study abroad for a summer, a semester or a year; compete on one or more of 11 men's and 13 women's sports teams at the NCAA Division I level or on one of 44 club and intramural sports; and take part in any of more than 250 extracurricular groups and activities.

### **ACCREDITATION**

Villanova University is accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education, an institutional accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation. In addition, Villanova and its undergraduate programs have received accreditation from the American Chemical Society, the Computing Accreditation Commission, and the National Catholic Education Association. Villanova is a member in good standing of the National Association for College Admission Counseling. Villanova School of Business programs are accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB). Villanova College of Engineering programs are accredited by the Accreditation Commission (EAC) of ABET (Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology). The Villanova College of Nursing program is fully accredited by the CCNE (Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education) and is approved by the State Board of Nursing of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Graduates are eligible to sit for the NCLEX (registered nurse licensing exam).



## CITY OF PHILADELPHIA

Villanova University is located 12 miles west of the city of Philadelphia, Pa., birthplace of American independence. Philadelphia is an absolutely indispensable resource easily accessible for Villanova's student community. Buses and trains stop regularly on our campus, and you can be in Center City in a matter of minutes.

There, the cultural attractions of one of the nation's most historic areas are yours to choose from: Independence Hall, where the Declaration of

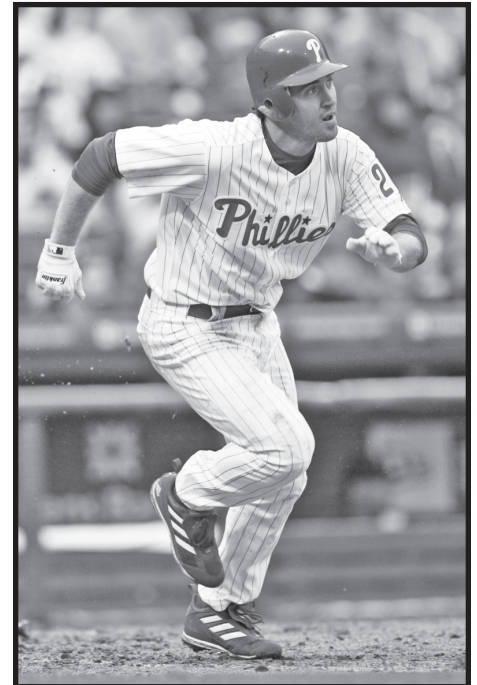

Independence was adopted, and the U.S. Constitution was written; the Academy of Music, home of the world-renowned Philadelphia Orchestra; the Liberty Bell; the Philadelphia Museum of Art, the country's third-largest art museum; and countless theaters, galleries, nightclubs and historical sites.

Philadelphia is also home to some of the country's most exciting professional sports teams. You can watch the 2008 World Champion Philadelphia Phillies play baseball at Citizens Bank Park and the NFL's Philadelphia Eagles hit the gridiron at Lincoln Financial Field.

# PRESIDENT, REV. PETER M. DONOHUE, O.S.A.

The Rev. Peter M. Donohue, O.S.A., Ph.D., became the 32nd president of Villanova University on June 1, 2006. As president, Father Donohue has worked together with students, faculty, staff, alumni, and parents to strengthen the Villanova community and renew its commitment to the institution's Catholic, Augustinian, and educational mission.

## PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

Under Father Donohue's leadership, Villanova launched a new Strategic Plan - "Igniting the Heart. Inspiring the Mind. Illuminating the Spirit." - which is designed to build upon the success achieved in recent years and to guide the University through 2020. Core to the Plan, which was approved by the University's Board of Trustees in December 2009, are Villanova's distinctive attributes of academic excellence, strong community, service to others, personal attention, and a platform for success. The Strategic Plan identifies academic and programmatic priorities and a Villanova Campus Master Plan that will guide the transformation of the University's physical plant to meet current and future needs.

Father Donohue also has spearheaded the University's environmental sustainability efforts, highlighted by his signing of the American College and University Presidents Climate Commitment in June 2007, which pledges that the University will work to achieve climate neutrality.

## A COMMITMENT TO THE COMMUNITY

Father Donohue believes strongly in the important role that community service



plays in the Villanova educational experience and has instituted an annual Day of Service each September as a way for the University community to put its Augustinian ideals into action. Nearly 5,000 students, faculty, staff, and alumni take part in projects throughout Greater Philadelphia, making it one of the largest single-day service initiatives in the region.

Father Donohue serves as the chair of the Greater Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce Regional College and University Presidents' Council, a consortium of leaders in higher education that meets regularly to share ideas and discuss issues facing the more than 100 colleges and universities located throughout the region. Father Donohue also serves as a member of the Board of Trustees for Villanova University as well

as the boards of Merrimack College in North Andover, Ma., Malvern Preparatory School in Malvern, Pa., the Greater Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce, the Association of Catholic Colleges and Universities, and the Association of Independent Colleges and Universities of Pennsylvania. In addition, he is an Honorary Trustee of Campus Philly, a nonprofit organization that fuels economic growth by encouraging college students to study, explore, live, and work in the Greater Philadelphia region.

## AN ACCOMPLISHED SCHOLAR

Born in Bronx, N.Y., and raised in Royal Oak, Mich., Father Donohue earned a B.A., with a concentration in theatre and communication arts, from Villanova University in 1975 and was ordained an Augustinian priest in 1979. He holds an M.A. in theatre from the Catholic University of America, a M. Div. from the Washington Theological Union, and a Ph.D. in theatre from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. While pursuing his doctorate, Father Donohue taught theatre at the University of Illinois, where he received honors for outstanding teaching. He is a member of Phi Kappa Phi, the nation's oldest, largest, and most selective all-discipline honor society.

Father Donohue is a tenured associate professor at Villanova who served as chair of the University's department of theatre from 1992 to 2006. He annually directed musical theatre productions on campus, earning six Barrymore Award nominations and one Barrymore Award for Outstanding Direction of a Musical from the Theatre Alliance of Greater Philadelphia.

# DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS, VINCE NICASTRO

Vince Nicastro enters his 13th year as the Villanova University Director of Athletics in 2012-13.

As the Director of Athletics, Nicastro is responsible for leading a Villanova Athletics Department that is committed to excellence both in competition and in the classroom. The broad-based Wildcat athletics program is comprised of 24 men's and women's varsity sports and over 500 student-athletes. In addition, club sports and an extensive intramurals and recreation program fall under the auspices of the Athletic Department. Villanova is a member of the Big East Conference and the Colonial Athletic Association Football Conference.

In his 12 seasons at the helm, Nicastro has overseen significant success in the key areas of intercollegiate athletics, and the past three years in particular have been a period of great achievement.

On the heels of back-to-back extremely successful campaigns Villanova continued its momentum during the 2011-12 academic year. The Wildcats saw the men's and women's cross country teams each win BIG EAST team titles and qualify for the NCAA Championships. The women's cross country team finished third at the national championships and Sheila Reid repeated as the individual national champion. During the spring season, Reid led Villanova to the program's 30th Penn Relays title when the Wildcats won the distance medley relay. Other highlights for the 2011-12 academic year included the men's soccer team advancing to the semifinals of the BIG EAST Championship for the first time ever and Villanova hosting the inaugural BIG EAST Championship for men's lacrosse at Villanova Stadium.

Villanova finished 2010-11 ranked 50th in the NACDA Directors' Cup, a program which recognizes a school's across-the-board success in athletics. The ranking was Villanova's highest since 2003-04 and ranked the Wildcats second among non-Football Bowl Subdivision schools and fifth best among all BIG EAST schools. The 2010-11 academic year was highlighted by the women's cross country team winning its second consecutive and ninth all-time national championship. In all, five different teams advanced to national postseason play in 2010-11, including the men's lacrosse team earning an at-large bid to the NCAA Championships for the first time in its history after being ranked as high as No. 7 in the nation during the season. The football team reached the semifinals of the Division I Football Championship in its third straight playoff appearance and the men's basketball team played in the NCAA Tournament for the seventh consecutive year.

The successful campaign for the Wildcats in 2010-11 followed an equally impressive year in 2009-10, when Villanova celebrated national championships in women's cross country and football. The football team won its first-ever FCS national championship, while the women's soccer and men's basketball teams also made trips to the NCAA Tournament. In addition, the women's indoor track & field team captured the BIG EAST championship and the men's lacrosse team was ranked in the nation's top-10 during the inaugural year of men's lacrosse competition in the BIG EAST Conference.

Under Nicastro's stewardship, the men's basketball team qualified for the NCAA Tournament for seven straight years (2005-11) and played in the 2009 Final Four. The women's soccer team participated in six NCAA Tournaments from 2001-09 and the women's basketball program has tallied 20 wins or more six times since 2000 en route to earning a postseason bid in 10 of the last 13 years, including a visit to the Elite Eight in 2003. The football team has made four appearances in the NCAA playoffs since 2002, including semifinal appearances in 2002 and 2010 and winning the 2009 national championship.

In his tenure as Director, Nicastro has been instrumental in the growth of the Villanova Athletic Fund program, which once again achieved an unprecedented level of participation in 2011-12. Nicastro has also played an integral role in securing numerous major gifts for endowments and facility upgrades to benefit Villanova Athletics.

The most striking capital undertaking is the Davis Center for Athletics & Fitness that serves as a state-of-the-art practice facility for use by the men's and women's basketball programs and greatly improves the recreational and fitness offerings for the campus community. The \$18.7 million facility, which opened in November of 2007, represents the largest capital project in University history to be funded entirely through donor support. Other facility upgrades under Nicastro's watch include the Villanova Ballpark at Plymouth Meeting; a new softball complex; the Villanova Stadium Turf Replacement; the installation of a new track in Villanova Stadium, new track & field throwing sectors and numerous team locker room enhancements.

Achievement in the classroom has also remained a priority under Nicastro's leadership. During the 2011-12 academic year, Villanova student-athletes posted a 3.173 grade point average – making 17 consecutive semesters with a composite GPA above 3.0, while achieving exemplary graduation rates. Also in 2011-12, seven Wildcat teams received NCAA Public Recognition Awards for ranking in the top 10 percent in the nation for team GPA within their sport. In addition, Villanova saw 22 of its varsity sports post an APR score above the overall national average.

Those beyond the Villanova zip code have taken notice. *U.S. News and World Report* listed Villanova as one of the Top 20 athletic programs in the nation in 2003. In 2004, Villanova was recognized as the top program in the Big East Conference in a study conducted by the Laboratory for the Study of Intercollegiate Athletics at Texas A&M. In its first presentation of the Excellence in Athletics Cup, Villanova was cited for success in areas including NCAA postseason success, graduation rates, gender equity position and operating efficiency.

In 2003, Nicastro oversaw the second cycle of the NCAA's re-certification of Villanova Univer-

sity Athletics. He has also guided the University's implementation of a comprehensive Title IX compliance program which has increased opportunities for female student-athletes and enhanced resources for Villanova's women's programs.

Nicastro joined the Villanova Athletics Department in 1994 when he was hired as the school's Director of Ticket Operations. He was promoted to Assistant Athletics Director in 1997, and then elevated to the position of Associate Athletics Director soon thereafter. As an Associate Athletics Director, he was responsible for overseeing the department's administrative functions, including business operations, personnel and staffing and the sports medicine and strength/conditioning programs.

On his path to the Director's office, Nicastro served as the designated sport administrator for many of Villanova's men's and women's varsity programs, working closely to plan and develop all aspects of their sport's programs. Nicastro also coordinated Villanova's summer camp programs and the department's information technology issues.

Nicastro has also been active both inside and outside the University, serving on many key committees. He is a member of the Villanova University President's Cabinet and the University's Administrative Budget Committee, which plays a key role in crafting the University's operating budget and making recommendations for strategic investments. Nicastro is also the chair of the Big East Conference Finance Committee and formerly chaired the Big East Conference Athletic Directors Executive Committee and the Big East Conference Championships and Competition Committee. Nicastro has been a member of the Colonial Athletic Association Football Conference Executive Committee and is on the Executive Committee of the Philadelphia Sports Congress.

A 1987 graduate of Bloomsburg University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration/Accounting, Nicastro earned his MBA from St. Joseph's University in 1994. Nicastro and his wife Liz reside in Drexel Hill, Pa., with their 12-year old twin sons, Jake and Casey.

## ATHLETIC ADMINISTRATION

**BOB STEITZ****Senior Associate AD/External Operations**

Bob Steitz enters his 11th year as Villanova's Senior Associate Athletics Director for External Operations in 2012-13. In his role, Steitz oversees the department's marketing and promotion initiatives and manages the Villanova Athletics Radio Network and the 'Nova Nation All-Access broadcast packages.

Steitz arrived at Villanova in 2002 from the Atlantic 10 Conference where he had been since 1990. He served as Associate Commissioner at the Atlantic 10 since 1994 with his primary responsibilities being the Executive Producer of the Atlantic 10 Television Network, coordinating and implementing the league's marketing and television strategies, overseeing all aspects of the men's basketball tournament, and planning and implementing the conference's basketball and football schedules.

Prior to being named Associate Commissioner, Steitz was the Associate Commissioner at the Northeast Conference where he oversaw NCAA Compliance and was the Director of Championships.

Steitz began his career in collegiate athletics at Fordham University where he was the Athletic Operations Coordinator for one year from 1982 to 1983. He was then promoted to Assistant Director of Athletics in August of 1983, a position he held until August of 1985 when he left to become Assistant Director of Athletics at Florida International University. Steitz has been a key figure on a number of athletic committees and served on the NCAA Division I Baseball Committee from 2000-02 and from 2003-07. He previously served as chair of the NCAA Honor Committee. Steitz has also played key roles in a number of different events: the 2001 NCAA Men's Division I Basketball East Regional, the 1992 Basketball Tournaments of the Americas, the 1990 Goodwill Games, and the 1984 Summer Olympics Basketball Staff.

A 1980 graduate of Springfield College with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Health, Physical Education and Recreation, Steitz went on to earn his Master's of Education Degree in Athletic Administration from Springfield in 1981.

Steitz and his wife, Pam, reside in Blue Bell, Pa., with their 16-year old daughter Jessica and 12-year old son, Michael.

**LYNN TIGHE****Senior Associate AD/SWA**

Lynn Tighe is in her 15th season at Villanova, and currently is a Senior Associate Athletics Director and the Senior Women's Administrator. She returned to her alma mater in November, 1998, as an Assistant Athletics Director and has since earned two promotions to her current capacity.

Prior to her current stint on the Main Line, Tighe served as the Director of Game Operations and Special Events for the American Basketball League's Philadelphia Rage from 1997-1998. As director, Tighe was responsible for planning, coordinating and implementing all game day operations and special events. She was also the Director of Merchandising, and created and directed the Merchandising Department.

Tighe is a 1987 graduate of Villanova University, where she earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Economics. A four-year member of the Wildcat women's basketball team, Tighe ranks second in program VILLANOVA TODAY in career assists. The starting point guard for three seasons, Tighe helped lead the team to Big East Tournament titles and NCAA Tournament appearances in 1986 and 1987. She was chosen as a first team All-Big East performer as a senior in 1987. Tighe was inducted into the Villanova Athletic Hall of Fame in November 1998 and to the Big Five Hall of Fame in January 1998.

Tighe returned to Villanova in 1987 as an assistant women's basketball coach for head coach Harry Perretta, a position she maintained until 1989. From 1989-91, she served as a volunteer assistant coach for the Wildcats. Tighe is single and resides in Newtown Square, Pa.

**REV. ROB HAGAN, O.S.A.****Associate AD**

In his ninth season at Villanova University, Rev. Rob Hagan, O.S.A. is an Associate Athletics Director. As part of his role in the Athletic Department, he oversees the areas of Personnel, Sports Medicine and Strength and Conditioning. Father Hagan came to Villanova in 2003 as the Assistant Athletics Director for Compliance, and was promoted to his current position in July, 2004.

Father Rob graduated from Villanova with a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1987. He went on to earn a J.D. from Widener University School of Law in 1990. After receiving his law degree, Father Rob spent seven years as an attorney with Gillin and Associates, where he served as Criminal Defense Counsel, in addition to handling contract negotiations, arbitrations and mediations. He also served as assistant counsel to the Solicitor for the Delaware County Solid Waste Authority and the Delaware County Register of Wills.

Father Rob entered the Order of Saint Augustine in 1997. **THE JOHN "JAKE" NEVIN FIELD HOUSE**

Officially opened on April 1, 1932 as the Villanova Field House, the Field House was renamed to honor long-time Wildcat athletic trainer John "Jake" Nevin on November 22, 1985. Once the home of both the Wildcat men's and women's basketball teams, the building is currently home to the women's volleyball squad, as well as administrative offices and training facilities. Originally built at a cost of \$350,000, the Field House has hosted Villanova's commencement exercises, numerous high school commencements, concerts, lectures, funerals, masses, dances and plays.

**THE PAVILION**

Officially opened in February 1986, The Pavilion is the current home of the Wildcat men's and women's basketball teams. With a seating capacity of 6,500, the Pavilion also has hosted commencements, receptions, banquets, dances and concerts since the opening. Also included in The Pavilion is a 200-meter indoor track, tennis courts and batting cages for the baseball and softball teams.

**VILLANOVA STADIUM, GOODREAU FIELD & THE JUMBO ELLIOTT TRACK**

Dedicated on October 8, 1927, and built at a cost of \$500,000, numerous improvements and additions have been made to the original home of the Wildcats since then. The structure is officially known as Villanova Stadium and seats 12,000 spectators. It has hosted football, field

hockey, men's and women's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer, and international track meets, as well as commencements and other functions. The playing field was dedicated to the memory of Leo J. Goodreau, a football player who died due to injuries in practice, on May 7, 1930. On September 27, 1980, the running track was dedicated to Villanova's legendary track & field coach, James "Jumbo" Elliott. In the summer of 1992, new surfaces were placed on the playing field (Astroturf-8) and track (Rekortan S). During the summer of 1997, state-of-the-art lights were installed, improving the quality of all Wildcat night contests. In the summer of 1999, a Stadium Renovation project took place with the addition of a press facility that includes a 100-person meeting room for all Athletic Department members to utilize, along with a first-class

facility for all media members to use. Over the past few years, the playing field and track have been completely replaced. In the summer of 2010, brand new artificial turf was installed onto the playing field in time for the start of preseason workouts. The playing field features a synthetic grass surface known as FieldTurf. The track surface was replaced during the summer of 2007 and made possible the return of the BIG EAST Outdoor Track & Field Championships to Villanova. The stadium was the host site of the conference meet in 2008 and 2009, and the championships will return to Villanova once again in 2011.

**DAVIS CENTER**

The Davis Center for Athletics and Fitness was formally dedicated on November 8, 2007. The name of the building honors the generous contributions of brothers James and William Davis and their families. Jim Davis is a 1981 graduate of Villanova, while Bill Davis is a member of the class of '85.

Funded entirely through private donations, the Davis Center for Athletics and Fitness is a three-story, 55,000 square foot structure located on Ithan Avenue in front of The Pavilion. It includes a lobby atrium highlighting the long and proud history of Villanova men's and women's basketball, complete with photos and other fascinating memorabilia from the history of the sports on campus. The atrium also contains photos of Wildcat fans, a group known emphatically as the "Nova Nation." The first two floors house office space for both programs; two practice courts, one for each team; locker rooms; a weight room, cinema, and a sports medicine area.

## VILLANOVA FACILITIES

The third floor of the Davis Center is devoted entirely to fitness and is open to all segments of the Villanova community. With windows showcasing the university's main campus, the area features 40 cardio machines, selectorized weight equipment, as well as free weights. There is a large meeting space that is utilized for such group exercise as aerobics, yoga and pilates.

The new facility is environmentally friendly with energy-saving motion sensor lights and ecologically-sound storm water management. In addition, over 250 new trees have been planted around the facility.

### VILLANOVA SOFTBALL FIELD

In the spring of 2007, the Villanova softball team moved to its brand new stadium on Pike Field along Lancaster Avenue. The facility underwent improvements before the 2008 and 2009 seasons. The field includes dugouts, warm-up areas and a state-of-the-art playing surface. Bleachers are located one level above the field along with an enclosed press box. Other features on the field level include storage areas for the softball team as well as the men's and women's track & field teams.

### VILLANOVA SOCCER COMPLEX

Located behind St. Mary's Hall on the ever-growing West Campus is Villanova's soccer field. It was established in the fall of 1992 as the new home for the Wildcat men's and women's soccer programs and was recently leveled and re-sodded for a top-notch facility. During the summer of 1999, new bleachers were added to the facility that seat 1,000 people. New locker rooms for the men's and women's soccer teams were added in the fall of 2001 and the entire field was re-sodded during the summer of 2007.

### VILLANOVA SWIM CENTER

Completed in July, 1985 at a cost of \$1.5 million, The Swimming Center is home to Villanova's men's and women's swimming and diving teams, as well as the women's water polo squad. Measuring 25 meters by 25 yards, with depths ranging from 4 1/2 feet to 13 feet, it features 10 lanes for competitive swimming, two 1-meter diving boards, and 3-meter diving platforms. During the summer of 1999, new offices and a meeting room were constructed for the swimming and women's water polo coaching staffs. The

men's and women's locker rooms were renovated during the summer of 2007.

### PIKE FIELD

Located across the street from Villanova Stadium, this practice facility was re-built in 1994 at a cost of \$350,000 to include a complete state-of-the-art throwing area for track and field meets that allows three events to be contested simultaneously. The throwing areas were renovated in the spring of 2008. This field, equipped with a drainage system to ensure high quality conditions year-round, also serves as an outstanding practice field for Villanova's varsity teams as well as intramural competition.

### VILLANOVA TENNIS COMPLEX

A brand new tennis facility was constructed on Villanova's West Campus during the summer of 1999. This new facility is home to both the Wildcat men's and women's tennis teams. Recreational courts are also available on the South Campus adjacent to Stanford Hall, and on the Main Campus behind Kennedy Hall.

### ATHLETIC TRAINING ROOM

Villanova's Jake Nevin Field House features a full-service athletic training room. The facility contains state-of-the-art equipment specifically for the treatment and rehabilitation of athletic injuries. This facility now contains 2,200 square feet of training space. All advanced treatment and rehabilitation is performed under the supervi-

sion of four full-time National Athletic Training Association certified personnel. In the cases requiring physical therapy needs, or subspecialized medical evaluation, outside consultants are utilized.

### EQUIPMENT ROOM

The Equipment Room is committed to servicing the athletic teams, coaches and student-athletes at Villanova University by facilitating ordering, storage and inventory of athletic equipment and apparel; laundry services; and subcontracting of embellishment to be placed on uniforms.

Overseeing the Villanova Equipment Room is Lionel Brodie, who came to Villanova in the fall of 2007. Brodie is a 2001 graduate of the University with a major in Marketing and a minor in Communications. He worked for And 1 Basketball from 2001 to 2005, beginning in distribution and eventually working with production and retail as well. Brodie is a Philadelphia native and also worked for Treadways Corporation prior to coming to Villanova.

Tom Dunphy joined the Villanova community in June 2002 after nearly three years as the Head Equipment Manager at Northeastern University in Boston, Massachusetts. Originally from DeMatha High School in Maryland, Dunphy was awarded a football scholarship to attend Northeastern, where he graduated from in 2000 with a BS in Communication Studies. Football related injuries forced him to step off the field and he found a perfect fit in Equipment Management. Tom

received his AEMA certification and is CPR certified. In June 2009, Dunphy was named the Region II Equipment Manager of the Year by the AEMA for implementing a brand marketing initiative for all Villanova Athletic teams to align all University logos and licensing trademarks. As the Assistant Equipment Manager, Dunphy is primarily responsible for the day-to-day operations of managing the football team's needs. He also assists in other Equipment Room functions as needed.

## ACADEMIC SUPPORT CENTER

Located within the Jake Nevin Field House is the Villanova Athletic Academic Support Center. Working in conjunction with Dr. Dan Regan, Villanova's Academic Advisor for Athletics, Associate Director of Academic Support Amy Morgan administers the daily operations of this full-service facility. In addition to monitoring the academic progress of all Wildcat student-athletes, the center includes work space for student-athletes and computer workstations with word-processing and laserjet printers for use by student-athletes. Also, various computer programs are offered, such as a resumé writing program.

## ACADEMIC RESOURCE CENTER

The Villanova Department of Athletics expanded Academic Support's domain into the newly renovated stadium press box. With the addition of a new infrastructure during the summer of 1999, the department's new Academic Resource Center was formed. The benefits of the ARC include:

- Improved efficiency of academic support services to student-athletes.
- Expansion and consolidation of several academic resources, such as freshmen-mentoring and tutoring programs.
- Ability to offer a more personally tailored academic support system to those student-athletes in need.

### THE ARC INCLUDES:

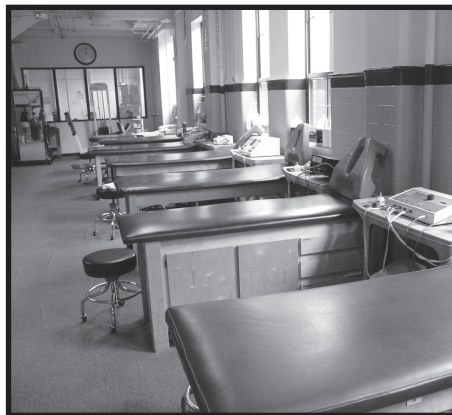

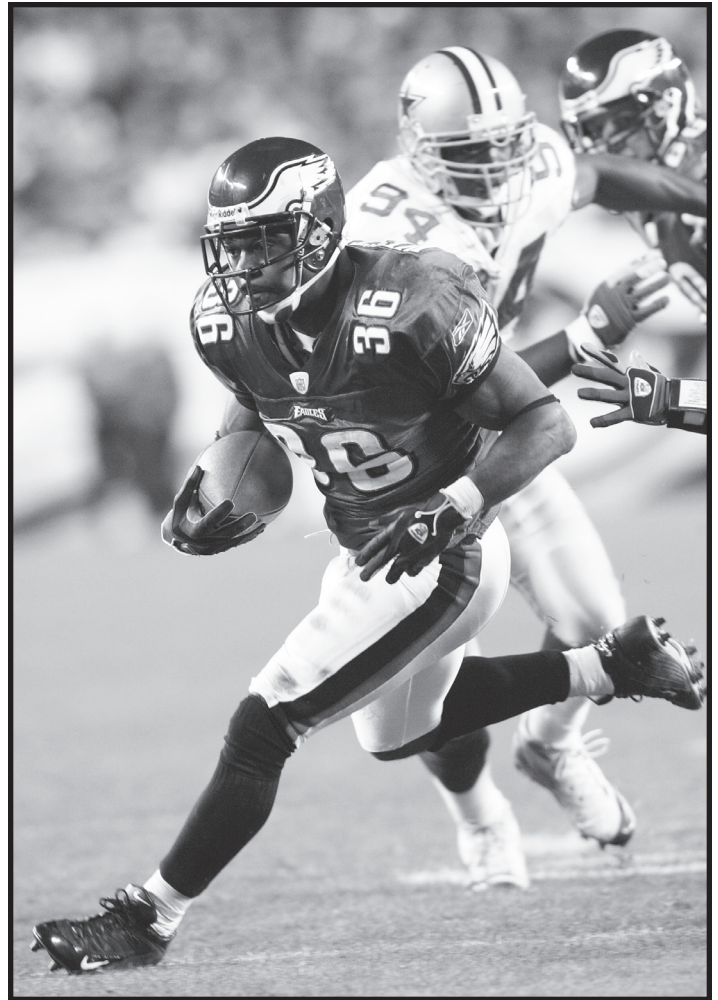
At Villanova, the Office of Academic Support reports to the Academic Vice-President. It works with the Athletic Department, whose directors and coaches have always understood the primacy of academics.

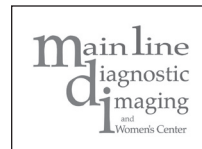

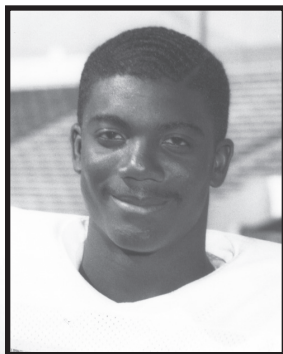
