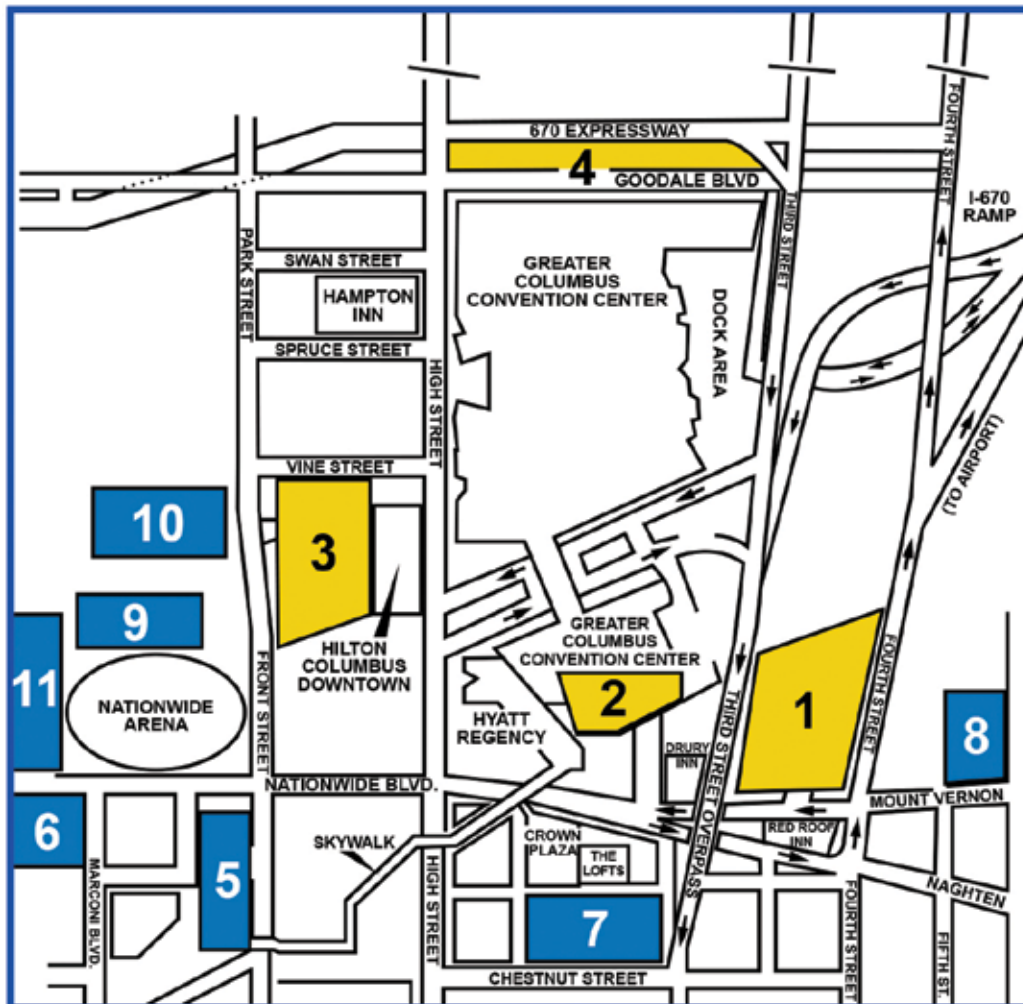

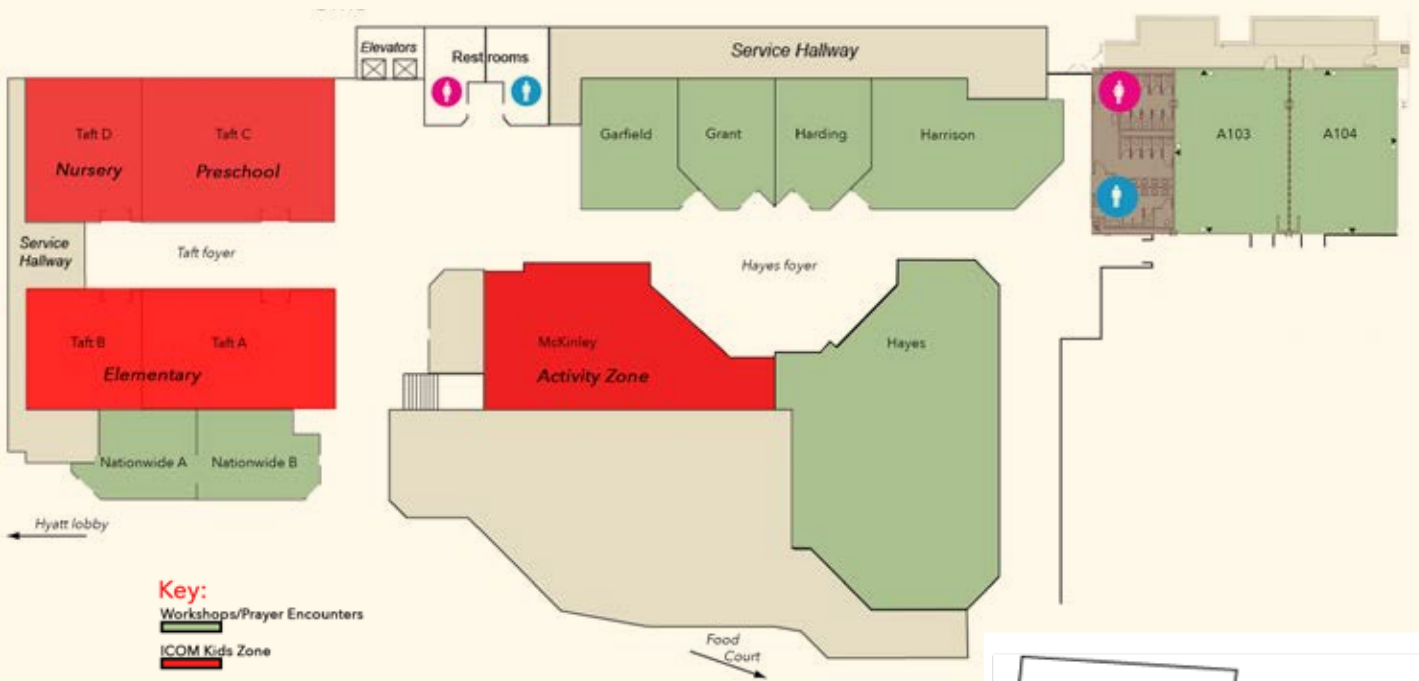


Parking

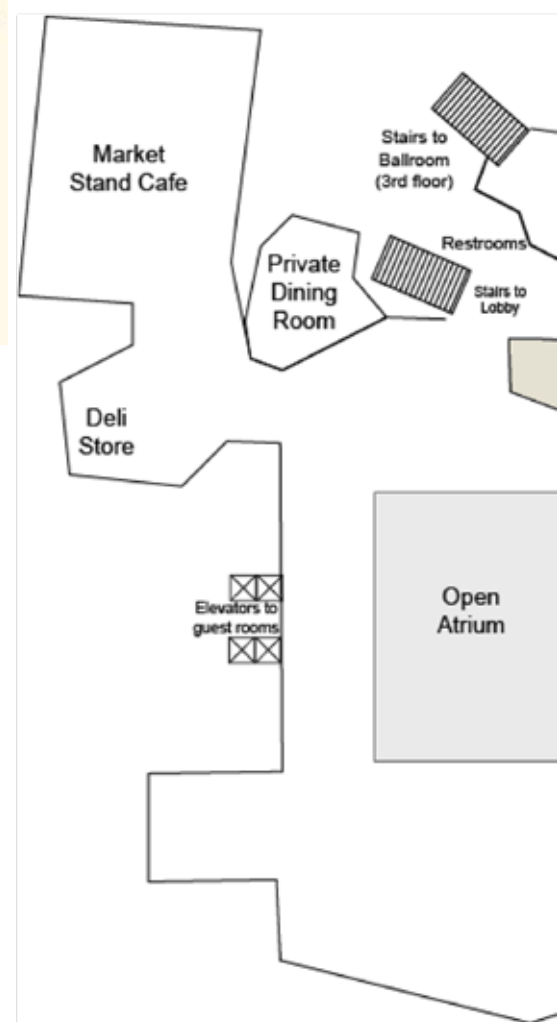

2013 REPORT

This report contains information that was collected up to the time of printing this program book for 2013.



Ask the Almighty

1. Report on Unreached People Groups---U4TU.
In 2011, under the leadership of Dudley Rutherford, 2011 NACC President, "*Unleashed For The Unreached*" was launched with the hands and feet of Doug Lucas and a team of folks at Team Expansion. Notice this progression:
 - The Wall (a model of all the names on a Vietnam Memorial type display) was created in 2011. It was used in 3 events that year.
 - In 2012, the Wall was in 32 events, and a second wall was added in Sept.
 - In 2013, the Wall(s) were in 62 events, and a third wall was added.
- At the time of this writing, September of 2013, nearly 2000 people have signed up to pray or advocate for a specific group.
- In 2013, the Northside Christian Church in Fresno, CA sent 3 families to be fulltime missionaries to two unreached people groups in India & Mexico.

2. Light the Torch Prayer Vigils, 19 held.
3. Christ's Church of the Valley, Phoenix, Arizona reports
 - Hosting 3rd "Global Prayer Cast with Team Expansion/Unleashed For The Unreached.
 - 30 Days of Prayer for opening new campus and capital campaign, "Step Up So That Others May Know"

- 1. The International Disaster Emergency Service** continues to come alongside the Church. Here is a summary of their 2013 report:
 - 111 cases of Disaster Assistance
 - 53 instances of Community Development
 - 50 Hunger Relief Projects
 - 36 Medical Projects
 - 14 Evangelistic Projects
- 2. Kore Foundation.** In 2011 Kore began talking about how a poultry industry would help the Haitian people: 1. Establish jobs, 2. Put more protein in their diet, and 3. bring more income to the local church. There are now 108 chicken farmers in this system and KORE has expanded the opportunities for Haitians to be self-sufficient while working with Zamorano University in Honduras, NC State, Texas A&M and the University of Florida providing agricultural training, goat reproduction, tilapia ponds, and most notably the world's leading cholera research with the Univ. of Florida. A vocational school has been created to teach post-secondary job training in culinary arts, diesel mechanics, small engine repair and vocational agriculture. KORE has also freely collaborated with many other missions in Haiti. These efforts also help support a few children's homes and a K-12 school for 1,200 children.
- 3. New Mission Systems Inc.** reports holding their 1st International Christian Business conference equipping 50 Business as Mission native leaders.
 - NMSI also trained 12 CHE evangelists in Kenya
 - NMSI held training for national pastor/leaders in 5 countries, 9 different venues, 794 participants.
- 4. Christ's Church of the Valley**, Phoenix:
 - 9 Homes built in Rocky Point, Mexico
 - Finished Bible translation of NT in 3 languages on Solomon Islands through the Seed Company: Baegu, Baelelea, & Fataleka
 - Distributed 15,000 Bibles to prison inmates in 13 states through Rescued Not Arrested.
 - Created and provided open source curriculum, materials and online database for churches in Phoenix to engage foster care crisis.
 - Hosted Int'l Wholistic Missions Conference
 - Launched 20 non-profits ministries with essentials to begin work.
 - Donated ranch with land and facilities to a local Native American ministry start up.
- 5. Lifebridge Christian Church**, Boulder, CO reports thriving in the midst of a 500 year flood that hit Boulder and surrounding areas in 2013. Their facility was an emergency evacuation center, they served 6500 hours, provided shelter for 3,000 victims, fed 16,000 meals, and rebuilt homes in the aftermath.
- 6. Lifeline Christian Mission** reports over 5 million meals were packaged in 2013 through their ABC Food Ministry for Haitian families. Opened a second children's home for 76 young Haitian children.
- 7. Good New Production, Int'l** reports they have completed 11 language versions of The Global Gospel with 10 more to be completed by the end of 2015. Their Project NOMaD have 6 actively producing teams which serve as extensions of the GNPI sites around the world.





Servants

1. ICOM reports 86 decisions for fulltime Christian service from our Kansas City conference in November, 2013
2. An early outcome of our Restoration Revolution discussions was the birth of a new ministry to international college students called Crossroads Int'l Student Ministry. This ministry was started by veteran campus minister Greg Swinney in Kearney, Nebraska. In these last 3 years, Greg has been very busy learning the landscape of colleges and universities in our nation and at this point there are seven statewide directors in Florida, Pennsylvania, Nebraska, Indiana, North Carolina, Kansas and Arkansas. Other locations being managed by volunteer positions are in: Ohio, Illinois, New York, California, Texas and Minnesota. There are prayer partners from every state of the USA, as Greg and his team are working and training others to serve these international students.
3. New Mission Systems, INC (NMSI) reports 18 new affiliates who have made full-time commitments.
4. Christ's Church of the Valley, Phoenix, AZ
 - 120 students made decisions to go into full-time Christian Service at HS camp
 - 11 adults chose new career paths to full-time Christian service
 - Began new Residency Ministry training program for 25 college upperclassmen, 22 of which are already in a ministry.

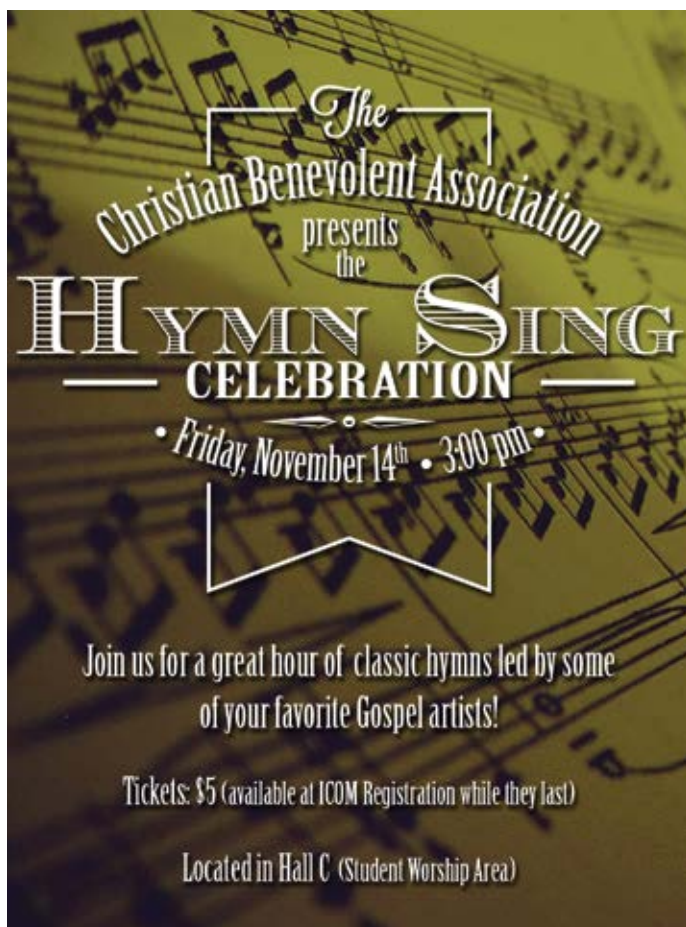

Transformational Community Development

Micro-economic development combines sound theology, solid research, foundational principles and proven strategies that prepare you for Christian transformational ministry among the poor in the local community or abroad.

Global Business

The transformational influence of the Gospel has been redeeming the marketplace since the first century. The 'cultural mandate' in Genesis 1 has mandated marketplace ministry since the creation of the world! This radical and relevant approach to the mission of the church is not new to scripture.

Jonathan Track

Discover how you can join God in sparking CHURCH PLANTING MOVEMENTS where Christ is not known. Discover afresh the transformational nature of the Gospel as responsive people groups, who were formerly resistant, are now reaping an abundant harvest among their own peoples and other unreached peoples.

Justice

"Ministry in its Biblical sense rests on the three legs of evangelism, discipleship and justice." If any of these three are missing in our overall ministry strategy, then we are not practicing Biblical ministry. We must combine the three. May Amos' admonition be ours as well, 'Let justice roll down.'"

Life Coaching

Counseling tries to fix the past. Mentoring gives me the opportunity to share with you what God has shared with me. Life coaching, whether informal or formal, gives us insight into what God is doing. It draws out of you what God has put in you. We can all coach.

Missionary Care Track

The Missionary Care track is designed for missionaries themselves. It focuses on the care to be given to missionaries to assure or recover their spiritual, emotional, relational, familial and psychological wholeness.

Mobilization Track

These six sessions, led by eighteen speakers from five organizations, address essential topics that every missionary candidate needs before relocating. Urban

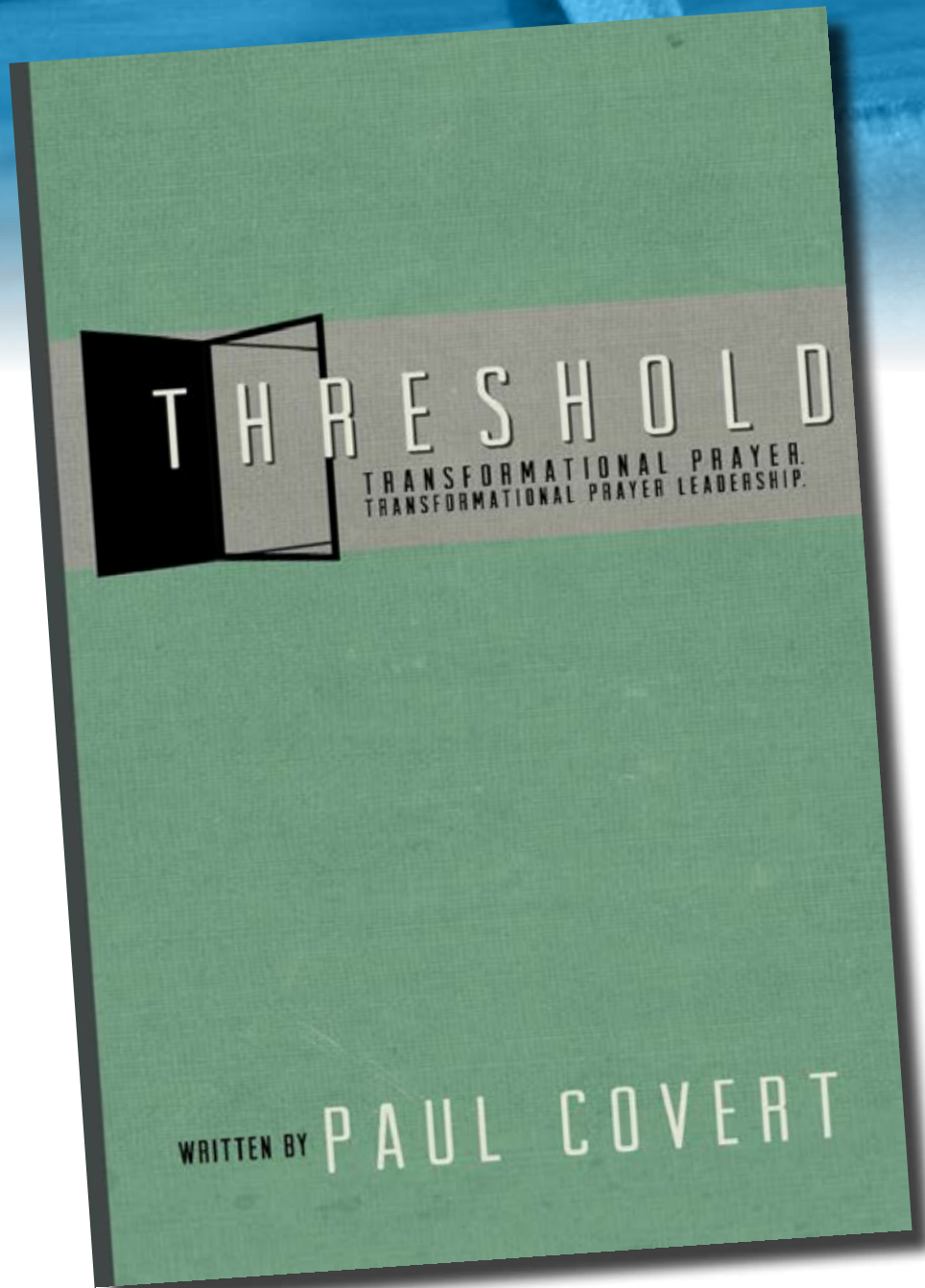

Crossroads Christian Church, Evansville, IN

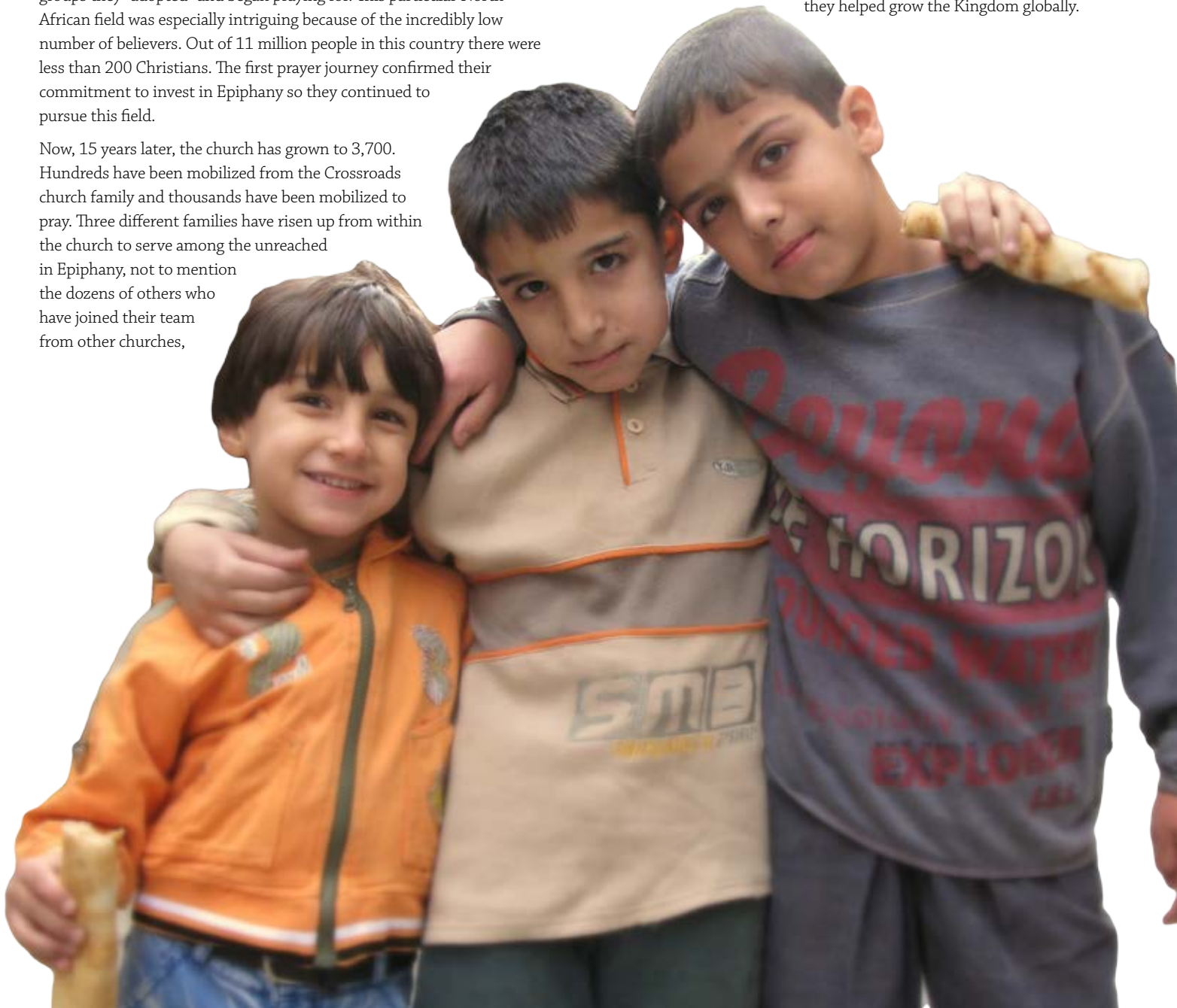
Crossroads Christian Church in Evansville, IN has been working among a Muslim people group (code-named Epiphany) in North Africa since 1999. The church of 1000 started their project with a prayer journey in 1999 to visit their chosen group to see if this was the direction God was taking them. Crossroads was in the process of wrapping up a successful church partnership project in Ukraine and was eager to take a step toward reaching a new unreached people group.

The National Missionary Convention in 1999 highlighted the 6,900 unreached people groups of the world. It was then that Crossroads “adopted” two least reached regions and committed to praying for them and about their involvement among them. Epiphany was one of the groups they “adopted” and began praying for. This particular North African field was especially intriguing because of the incredibly low number of believers. Out of 11 million people in this country there were less than 200 Christians. The first prayer journey confirmed their commitment to invest in Epiphany so they continued to pursue this field.

Now, 15 years later, the church has grown to 3,700. Hundreds have been mobilized from the Crossroads church family and thousands have been mobilized to pray. Three different families have risen up from within the church to serve among the unreached in Epiphany, not to mention the dozens of others who have joined their team from other churches,

making Epiphany one of Team Expansion’s largest field teams. The team, with input from Crossroads and Team Expansion, has seen amazing fruit through internet evangelism and important work in the north, mid and southern parts of the country. For its part, Crossroads has learned volumes working among those of the Islamic tradition.

They give credit to their overseas work for having helped them in Evansville, as well. As one Crossroads pastor said, “This project has allowed us to share our learnings with other like-minded people and to continue this work in other similar fields. This work has brought to life our understanding of global evangelism and changed our church family significantly.” When they started the church partnership project in Ukraine they were a church of 350, but by the time they finished about 10 years later they had grown to well over 1000. God grew them locally while they helped grow the Kingdom globally.

Fern Creek Christian Church, Louisville, KY

Fern Creek Christian Church in Louisville, KY began their PACE project in 2007 when the missions committee started meeting to discuss what God wanted from their missions program. They began discussing the concept of PACE and knew it was the best way for them to spread the gospel to the unreached around the world. After a few months of praying, Fern Creek settled on a country in the Middle East (currently embroiled in war) and decided to name their project Mara.

In 2007 Fern Creek had around 600 in attendance and 7 on the missions committee. They planned a prayer journey to Mara to explore the possibility of adopting them as their unreached people group and start the process of beginning a church planting movement among the people there. Two missions committee members traveled there on their first prayer journey. After more prayer and more confirmation, 4 more went the next spring. Soon afterward, they recruited their first missionary who would join the Mara project and go live among the Mara people. One of their missions committee members became more and more passionate about the project. After multiple trips and countless hours praying for the country, he and his wife decided they were being called to join the team as well.

They were raising support and preparing to begin their work when civil war broke out in Mara in 2011. Fern Creek was afraid of what this meant

for their project and were worried they'd hit a roadblock in their goals of spreading the gospel among the people. They stayed faithful and continued to trust in God's provision and He did not disappoint. They stepped forward in faith and God led them to a language school in a neighboring land. The team started their language learning just 50 miles from the border of Mara. The civil war there kept the team out of Mara itself, but they continued to have faith and God continued to provide.

As the crisis got worse more and more refugees from Mara began fleeing into the land where they were studying language. Before they knew it, the team was working among Marans without even leaving their language school. Their ministry grew and they began providing refugee aid and sharing the gospel to the thousands and thousands of refugees who had fled tumultuous Mara.

At certain times they have felt discouraged or unsure of what their future will be since they are all but barred from entering the homeland of the people group they'd chosen, but God clearly has forged a path for them. They stepped out on faith and while they couldn't enter Mara, God brought the Marans to them. Their ministry has grown a lot in the past few years, going from a team of 2 to a team of 6, with others in the process of joining. God continues to move and their project continues to thrive, a true testament to God's faithfulness and to Fern Creek's trust in Him.

Rochester Christian Church, Rochester, IL

The PACE project at Rochester Christian Church (RCC), a church of about 525 members, began unexpectedly when a team visited Northern India in October 2011. Shortly after returning home from that trip, Elizabeth, one of the team members, attended ICOM and experienced The Wall of Unreached People Groups for the first time. Elizabeth was already carrying a burden for the people of India, but when she saw the overwhelming number of Unreached People Groups in India alone (7 ½ panels worth!), she felt paralyzed. A PACE volunteer sat with Elizabeth and gave her some next steps of how she could continue to pray and advocate for the people of India. Once back home, Elizabeth began listening in on the U4theU Webinars and shared the PACE information with her missions committee, staff, and elders. They too began to pray about RCC beginning a PACE project.

By the spring of 2012, Doug Lucas visited Rochester and shared more information on what a PACE project might look like for RCC. Because of RCC's Sister Church partnership with Grand Savann Christian Church (GSCC) of Haiti, a church of about 150 members, Doug suggested the 2 churches partner together on adopting an UPG. Elizabeth shared this information with Pastor Benito, the lead pastor of GSCC, and he too began to dream and pray about the 2 churches adopting an UPG in India together. In July 2013, Elizabeth visited Pastor Benito's church and shared with his prayer warriors about where God was leading both churches. They enthusiastically agreed to pray, not only for UPGs in India, but also for God to make a way for Pastor Benito to go on a survey trip to

India with RCC.

During the summer of 2014, the Lord brought several things together to emphasize His heart for UPGs and His desire for RCC to be involved with adopting an unreached group in India. As RCC was going through a sermon series based on the book *Live Life on Purpose* by Claude Hickman (which highlights the 10/40 Window and UPGs), they also hosted The Wall of Unreached People Groups and recruited approximately 30 more people to begin praying for all 6,900 UPGs. Then they sent a team to do survey work among their national partners in India. The team consisted of Elizabeth, Pastor Benito, 2 other RCC members, and a representative from Team Expansion.

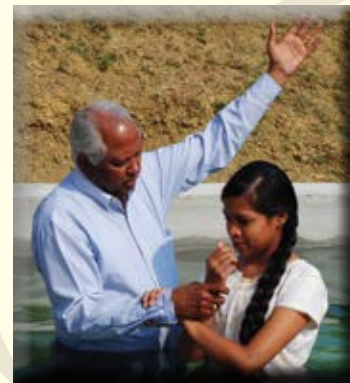
Since arriving home, the team has shared with both congregations and the RCC missions committee the results of the trip. They have not yet chosen a specific unreached people group, but God did confirm that this is indeed His plan for both Rochester and Grand Savann. He clearly revealed how He has already put the national ministry in India in place to lead the way in the work among UPGs. Currently, the national ministry in India is compiling a priority list of evangelists and UPGs and will send this list to both churches who will continue to pray about which people group they are to adopt together for the Glory of God!

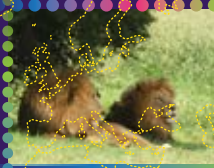

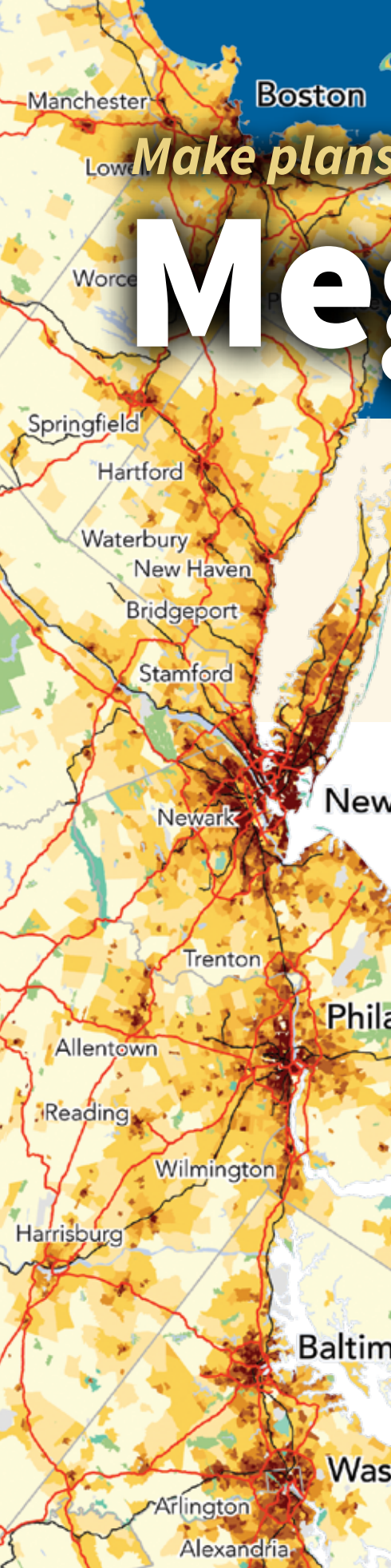

Megalopolis

For decades the Northeast area of the United States has been a focus for church planting.

It is one area of the USA where we have seen a decline of faith and church attendance. In fact, eight of the top nine “post-Christian” cities (*see sidebar) in the US are in the northeast. They are:

The need is great!

Why is this area of the country or world so important?

- *This is the most densely populated area in the USA.* In this 600-mile stretch along I-95, there are more than 50,000,000 people who live there. 50 MILLION! And this is not the largest megalopolis in the world, just the US.
- *This area of the USA contains 400 universities and colleges.*
- *New York City is the finance center of North America.*
- *Washington DC is the political center of North America.*
- *20% of the US Gross National Product (GDP) is generated here, the 4th largest in the world.*
- *20% of all US freight goes through a northeast port & 60% of all US international freight passes through a northeast seaport.*
- *The “world” is here!* Literally, the Northeast contains a huge immigrant population with many pockets of peoples blotted all over New York, Philadelphia, Boston, Baltimore and New Jersey. The 4 largest ancestries are African American, Italia, Irish and Puerto Rican. Other groups that can be found there are Jewish, German, Portuguese and French-Canadian. The 2nd largest Asian population can be found in the northeast of: Indian Chinese, Korean, Filipino in that order. There are also significant populations of Japanese, Vietnamese, Thais and Cambodians.

483 Churches that represent whole states, when the I-95 corridor — a 600-mile stretch is all we are defining here — contains 50,000,000 people. When you combine the population of the whole state, of each state, the ratio of the number of churches is even lower. There are four states in the country that have close to the number of churches for the whole northeast. They are: Indiana, Ohio, Illinois and Kentucky. Any one of these states has close or more than 485 churches.

It’s been called a “megalopolis.” Also called a “mega-region,” it is a clustered network of cities.

- In the 1950s, President Eisenhower ordered the creation of the U.S. Interstate Highway system. And this connected the dots of the big cities across the country.
- In the 1970s, the cities got crowded, and Americans seeking a little quieter life from the downtown area, moved out of the city, creating the suburbs.
- In the 1990s, Suburbia America began to connect the dots between large cities. Thereby, in the northeast, America’s largest city cluster network or “megalopolis” was created.

2015? With a theme of church planting? Richmond is perfect!

- Of all the states in the northeast, Virginia has the most Restoration Christian Churches.
- Virginia is in the middle of the east coast, so this allows the opportunity for churches along the whole east coast to attend.
- ICOM has found a wonderful partner in the Virginia Evangelizing Fellowship. The VEF has proven to be a great partner in that they are well connected to the many of the churches in their state. They communicate well with those churches leaders. They are well organized. They have a big kingdom vision and they are willing to collaborate with ICOM.
